


Mapping Stories of Shaughnessy Village – A Paired Course

Coming in Winter 2017!

This winter, Dawson College is excited to offer you an opportunity to complete your Research Methods credit and an Introduction to Geography credit in a single, paired course!



Over the Winter 2017 term, we will be discovering the neighborhood of **Shaughnessy Village**. If you've never heard of it, it's where you are when you cross Atwater Street, walking east! We will be exploring the neighborhood on foot (so wear a good pair of walking boots, and some warm socks!) and we'll be learning about its history, politics, culture, and geography. Since we'll be meeting twice a week for 3.5

hours, we will have plenty of time to go into the field and do some real hands-on research.

In this paired course, we will be satisfying the course requirements for Research Methods (300-300-DW) and for Introduction to Geography (320-102-DW) through a series of assignments that will teach us how to design and develop a term-long research project that is grounded in fundamental concepts in the discipline of geography. We will also be training as oral historians, committed to valuing the lived experiences of Shaughnessy Village residents as key sources of historical information.

What's a paired course, you ask?

A paired course involves the completion of two credits by focusing two separate courses around a single theme. The teachers of those two courses will work closely together to integrate their course activities so that the work done in one class will help you to complete the work for the other. Integrating content from two courses will give your term more coherence, and it will allow us all to reflect on how knowledge gained in one context can be applied to another.

Access to register for this paired course will not be available from the timetable. This means that you will need to preregister for these courses by getting in touch with Mark Beauchamp (who'll be teaching the Research Methods component) or with Geoff Pearce (who'll be teaching the Intro to Geography course).
